### DAY 1 – TRIER

Welcome to Germany's oldest city, meticulously crafted over the past two millennia and heavily influenced by the Roman Empire. Embark the Riverside Debussy and relax as your personal Butler helps you settle into your luxurious Suite. Tonight, meet fellow cruisemates during your first gourmet dinner on board.

### DAY 2 – COCHEM

On today's agenda is Cochem, settled over 2,000 years ago by the Celts and Romans. Sights here include the Old Town gate, old watchtower, half-timber houses, and the impressive city walls, which were built in 1332 and still stand today. RIVERSIDE CHOICE excursion options include a visit to the imposing 11th-century Reichsburg Castle with its Knights' Hall and lavish living quarters; a wine-lover's hiking adventure; or time exploring the craters and lava streams at Volcanic Eifel Nature Park, where volcanoes were still active until about 10,000 years ago. ### DAY 3 – BONN / COLOGNE

Your day begins in Bonn, Germany's former capital and home to 20 UN institutions. Morning options include the chance to see the city's Wilhelminian-style architecture and many highlights. You could also follow in the footsteps of composer Ludwig van Beethoven, or journey into the land of the dragon in the Seven Mountains for a rack railway ride up to the ruins of Drachenfels Castle. Later, if you're up to the challenge, join our e-bike ride along the river to the ship's next port. Your afternoon is in Cologne, whose impressive skyline is shaped by a dozen

Romanesque churches. The city's eternal legacy, though, stems from its Gothic, twin-spired cathedral. Get an inside look during a guided stroll, or get a real "taste" of Cologne during chocolate- or Kölsch Beer-focused excursions.

### DAY 4 – AMSTERDAM

During this morning's scenic cruising northward, your ship crosses the border into the Netherlands for after-lunch arrival in Amsterdam, the dazzling capital. Here, more than 62 miles (100 km) of canals wind through the historic districts. To make the most of your time, use virtual reality technology to follow in the footsteps of Anne Frank, or visit the unique Street Art & Graffiti Museum. This evening, don't miss our RIVERSIDE SIGNATURE dessert cruise through the romantic canals of Amsterdam.
